Final THAAD TSG Shipped to Lockheed Martin

The THAAD Demonstration Validation (DEM/VAL) program which started in 1992 delivered the last of the Tactical Station Group (TSG) to Lockheed Martin Missiles and Space Company (LMMS) on September 9.

A TSG consists of a Tactical Operations Station (TOS) and Launch Control Station (LCS). Under the DEM/VAL program, Litton designed and manufactured six TOS's and seven LCS's. Additionally, Litton developed and delivered incremental builds of BMC3I software which runs on the TSG and provides the operator with the information required to activate defense contingency plan and control of the kill vehicle through the launcher interface. The Litton-developed hardware and BMC3I software was used by LMMS for flight tests at White Sands Missile range in New Mexico and performed in accordance with the specifications supporting the flight test program.

The THAAD program is now in a transition phase from DEM/VAL to Engineering and Manufacturing Development (EMD) through a Risk Reduction program currently being executed in Huntsville and Agoura. In accordance with the EMD phase requirement that all the contractors be collocated in Huntsville, Data Systems has established a new facility there and is in the process of transferring THAAD system and software engineers interested in relocation to Huntsville. □

DSD on Winning Team for \$1.85 Billion Army/Air Force Program

Data Systems and TASC are principal partners with Lear Siegler Services, Inc. on a five-year, \$1.85 billion Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) task ordering contract from the U.S. Army Communication Electronics Command of Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and the U.S. Air Force Air Logistics Center in Oklahoma City.

As a major subcontractor on the Rapid Response to Critical Systems Requirements (R2CSR) contract, Litton will

provide integrated systems engineering and operational support, interactive electronic technical manual (IETM) support, computer-based interactive training systems (CBITS), point-to-point wiring and signal tracing technology, and technical data conversion services for Department of Defense and other federal agency systems. Data Systems will be responsible for the IETM and CBITS portions of the contract, for a potential value of approximately

\$9 million

According to Alden V. Munson, Jr., Litton senior vice president and group executive of Litton's Information Systems Group, "This contract vehicle will allow Litton's TASC and DSD divisions to provide to virtually any federal agency the engineering and operational expertise we already offer DoD customers in communications, navigation and surveillance systems." □

DSD San Diego Awarded GSA Contract for Advanced Tactical Display Console

DSD-San Diego has received contract awards from the U.S. Navy valued at \$6.2 million for 80 rugged Advanced Tactical Display Console (ATDC) workstations. ATDC, the operational data management and launch control console for the U.S. Navy Tomahawk Cruise Missile Weapon System, is composed of 100% Commercial Off The Shelf (COTS) technology. It is fully ruggedized to meet the Navy's requirements for shock and vibration as certified through a heavy-weight barge shock test. The Cruise Missile Weapon System is installed on 67 surface warships, with four ATDC installations per ship.



The ATDC is the operational data management and launch control console for the Navy's Tomahawk Cruise Missile Weapon System.

In support of this award, the DSD team, led

by Mr. Jim Gates, the ATDC Program Manager, and Mr. Marty Newman, Navy Business Development Representative, has been able to achieve significant contracting flexibility to the customer through the GSA schedule. In addition, procurement lead times in support of the Tomahawk program schedule have been reduced and commercial practices, such as warranties, have been introduced to ATDC consistent with the Government's Acquisition Streamlining initiatives.

Data Systems has delivered 64 consoles since production for the Navy first began in 1997. In addition to the current GSA order, procurements for over 100 systems are planned. Because of the visibility involved in performing on a national level defense program, the customer/Litton ATDC team has worked closely to incorporate a number of functionality upgrades, the latest being a fiber optic video interface. Presently, DSD is preparing to incorporate maintainability enhancements and introduce a technology insertion plan that proactively manages long term COTS obsolescence. □
